Clowns greeted the group each morning. Campers and counselors got to know each other through an ice breaking activity before beginning this year's grief project. Utilizing the metaphor that grief is a journey, children built and decorated wooden airplanes. To relate the metaphor to daily life, paper clouds appeared each day posing different questions about grief, such as,

"What is grief?" and "What would you tell someone your age who is grieving?" Attendees wrote down their ideas throughout the week and discussed them on the last day of camp.

Other highlights of the week included the memorial slideshow accompanied by popular music, featuring each attendee's name and a photo of their special person.

Compassion and empathy were on display when campers tended to the needs of one another and their counselors as the tears flowed freely. Changing the mood and tempo, the Harlem Wizards basketball team entertained the group with spectacular tricks and stayed to have lunch with the campers.



The Wednesday barbecue brought a host of special guests including Dr. Robert Siegel, Calvary Hospital's new medical director, and Kathy Siever from the Newman's Own Foundation, who brought with her a \$250,000 donation in the form of a giant check to support bereavement services. Additional elements of the barbecue included therapy dogs from the Good Dog Foundation and Calvary's own therapy dog, Banjo; caricature artists; ASE Drumming Circle, and dancing.



At the end of the week, campers wrote out postcards with a message to their future selves. They will receive these messages in 2020.



Brooklyn teen Sophie M. described why camp and group are important for kids who have experienced the death of a loved one. "I know even though we can all - at group and at camphave similar experiences; we're all also very different. Some kids love talking about their loved ones. Some just want to, you know, have fun and be distracted," she said.



All of the campers attend Calvary Hospital's yearround bereavement programs: "Precious Moments" for young children ages 6 to 9, the "In- Be-Tween" group for ages 10 to 12, and the Teen bereavement group for 13- to 18-year-olds. These groups, which meet at Calvary's Bronx Hospital, in downtown Brooklyn, and in Manhattan, have helped hundreds of children to date with their grief process.
