## STEP 2: HEALTHCARE PLANNING

#### WHY THIS MATTERS

Writing down your medical wishes ensures that your care reflects your values. In New York State, healthcare decisions can only be honored if they are clearly expressed in writing. While it may feel daunting, completing this step is straightforward and provides your loved ones and care team with the clarity they need.

In the section below, you will find space to record and organize the key documents that make up an advance care plan. We recommend keeping copies of every document with this guide— noting where originals and digital files are stored—so they can be quickly accessed when needed. You might also wish to provide an electronic copy of your healthcare proxy, HIPAA authorization, and living will to your healthcare agent. If this person ever needs to make healthcare decisions on your behalf, they will need to provide proof of their authority to act. Having an electronic copy eliminates the stress of having to retrieve a physical document.
